

A Note from Father Jim






The three most important aspects of interpreting scripture, **context**, **context**.

News from the Vestry



This was the theme of the vestry retreat. The Vestry has taken this as our guiding direction this year.

Chris Adams was elected Junior Warden and he will be forming a Building and Grounds Committee.

The Vestry wants to focus on how we invite people to church, how we welcome them once they enter the doors or the parking lot and how we help them connect to the life of the Parish.

One of the first action items was to approve funds to improve our signage and install the new monitor screen located above the name badge bulletin board in the Narthex.

This monitor screen will be updated every week so the bulletin board will never be dated. Some of you may think these monitor screens are tacky, but there's nothing more tacky than a messy out-of-date bulletin board as was the case in a previous church. We had a beautiful bulletin board with a border around it in red paper and nothing on it but thumb tacks. I think that defines tacky. Lol.

The monitor screen is to let both members and visitors see all that is happening here at St. James and it is a lot! We are quite the vibrant congregation. We are also putting the same happenings on the monitor in the parish hall, which also helps nonchurch groups meeting there to better see the life and activity of Saint James.

Members of the vestry are looking at outdoor signage and considering how we can make ourselves better known in the community. You'll be hearing more about this.

We also authorized an inspector to inspect our parish house to see what kind of shape it's in because we've noticed it is in need of repairs. We have brainstormed some ideas of how that building can best be used.

Worms and more worms! If there's an oak, there's a worm and did I mention there are oak trees pretty much everywhere I live in Clearwater, FL.

It's like they are floating in air just waiting to stick to my clothes, my hair, the dogs......
They are called Oak Leaf rollers (like inchworms). They feed on oak tree leaves and then do what most caterpillars do; they form a cocoon and turn into a moth. They are harmless – a nuisance but harmless.

Having been a grade 5 teacher, I truly enjoyed the science part, so I see worms as a sign of

change, undergoing a metamorphosis as they grow.

God used a worm and a plant to teach Jonah a lesson. Jonah admits to God that the reason he left the city of Nineveh was that he had known God would be merciful and he, Jonah, had wanted the city destroyed because the whole place was bad.

Jonah doesn't like that God is merciful, full of loving kindness, ready to forgive

sin. He wants a God who will punish evil. God is not happy that Jonah is so selfish. But because he is full of mercy, kindness, and compassion he sent a vine to give Jonah shade from the sun, and just when he was getting comfortable, God sent a worm to destroy it. The worm ate up the plant and Jonah learned a lesson. He needed to see the needs of others rather than just focusing on himself.




Dear God, help me grow and change to love you and serve others. Amen.







