We are entering into the liturgical time of holy of holies, which is holy week. We began with Jesus' procession into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, and we will gather outside the sanctuary to begin the service.

On Maundy Thursday, we will commemorate the last supper and the anticipation of Good Friday. That service will be at 5:30 Thursday night.

We will have a Good Friday service at noon on Friday.

We will then celebrate Easter, and everybody can return to their "regular schedule" of sitting and parking where their "claimed spot" is! I do hope,

though, that many of you will continue to park in the front parking lot every Sunday to communicate to the community how active we are.

I look forward to celebrating our first Easter together.

"Everything You Wanted to Know About Baptism but Did Not Know to Ask"

Our final Lenten soup and bread program is this Saturday, March 23.

Many of you know, I've written a book, entitled, "Preaching Baptism, a Practical Guide." The essence of the book is understanding baptism as a journey our whole lives, and understanding that by lifting up the values of baptism, most Sundays, people will be able to absorb more of the values expressed in the baptismal covenant.

You will notice, for example, that the baptismal font will be placed right inside the entrance of the church, so everybody walks by it as they enter into church beginning with Easter Sunday. Feel free to dip your hands in the waters of baptism and make the sign of the cross. We will renew our baptismal covenant on Easter Sunday and many times throughout the year. You will be splashed with the waters of baptism on Easter Sunday as well.

I invite you to come to our Lenten program this Saturday, where we will explore the many different ways that we can lift up baptismal values in the Sunday liturgy.

News from the Vestry

This was the theme of the vestry retreat. The Vestry has taken this as our guiding direction this year.

Chris Adams was elected Junior Warden and he will be forming a Building and Grounds Committee.



The Vestry wants to focus on how we invite people to church, how we welcome them once they enter the doors or the parking lot and how we help them connect to the life of the Parish.

One of the first action items was to approve funds to improve our signage and install the new monitor screen located above the name badge bulletin board in the Narthex.

This monitor screen will be updated every week so the bulletin board will never be dated. Some of you may think these monitor screens are tacky, but there's nothing more tacky than a messy out-of-date bulletin board as was the case in a previous church. We had a beautiful bulletin board with a border around it in red paper and nothing on it but thumb tacks. I think that defines tacky. Lol.

The monitor screen is to let both members and visitors see all that is happening here at St. James and it is a lot! We are quite the vibrant congregation. We are also putting the same happenings on the monitor in the parish hall, which also helps nonchurch groups meeting there to better see the life and activity of Saint James.

Members of the vestry are looking at outdoor signage and considering how we can make ourselves better known in the community. You'll be hearing more about this.

We also authorized an inspector to inspect our parish house to see what kind of shape it's in because we've noticed it is in need of repairs. We have brainstormed some ideas of how that building can best be used.

Siva Chiranjeevi MD, Cardiologist and his associates of the Georgia Institute, NEGMC led in conversation about Heart Health and answered the group's questions.














Work Day in the Gardens 03.22.2024

The Vigil will begin at 7:00pm Maundy Thursday, March 28th and end at 9:00 am Good Friday, March 29th.




Please sign up for the vigil and leave your email address if you don't regularly get emails from the church.

Intro to LINE DANCING

Everyone is invited to sign up for an Intro to Line Dancing to be held **Saturday, April 6th** at **10am until 11am in the Parish Hall.**

Line Dancing can often be recognized at weddings, events, dance halls and other social gatherings. This dance form practices the fundamentals of ALL dance styles in synchronized routines with sections repeating on either 2 or 4 walls. Line Dancing is accessible to all ages or



skill levels.

When she isn't in the office, we think that it's safe to assume that our Parish Administrator, Samantha Joedicke, is probably out somewhere cutting a rug with her dance crew!

Sam has acquired 24 years of dance experience since the age of 8, with twelve of those years of experience spent growing up in a studio with disciplines in both TAP and CLOGGING, and competing on the Southern Jewels Ruby Clogging Team for two of those final years. She then went on to discover "line dancing" in winter of 2018 before becoming certified through NTADance in Dance Fundamentals Levels I & II in November of 2022 with plans to obtain her DFIII in late April.

Sam has since started her own business, Neon Embers Entertainment, and has been teaching at numerous locations within the Rabun (Clayton Health and Fitness - Tuesdays 6pm-7pm), Oconee, and Pickens Counties and surrounding areas not only for weekly classes but also for private parties and events. She is excited for the opportunity to introduce this activity to her Church Community as a fun way to get moving!

Sam's Neon Embers Dancers can also be found participating in local events, fundraisers and happenings - they just performed at the Block Party over the weekend on Saturday, March 16th in Downtown Clayton.







