A Note from Father Jim

Lent is upon us and you are
invited to make this a holy
one.

Here are some of your choices:

- 1. Morning Prayer on Zoom every morning, Monday through Friday from 7:30 AM to 8:00 AM.**

I will be leading it whether I am here in Clayton or in Savannah. This is a beautiful service and the high point beyond the



praying, tends to be our brief discussion of one of Daily Office readings which will often end in laughter and insight. We will send a link every Monday and Thursday and it is the same link we use for the Lectionary class. The Daily Office Lectionary is different from the readings we read on Sundays. Following this lectionary every day means that every two years you read the entire Bible. For those of you who use *Forward Day by Day*, you will find the scripture references at the top of the page, but don't worry we will read one of them each morning. Please join me every morning during the week! You will find this a wonderful spiritual experience! You can pick up the *Forward Day by Day* pamphlets from the church or call the office.

2. Sunday Worship during Lent will be different (You can count these as your Lenten disciplines!).

- **You are invited to sit in a different pew during Lent.** You will find that this does affect your experience in worship plus you get to memorize the back of someone else's head. LOL.
- **We will use the actual physical book of The Book of Common Prayer** rather than having the entire service printed in the bulletin. Printing the entire service is helpful to visitors and recent members, so we will return to that practice Easter Sunday.
- **Prayers of the People** will be read from the pews by a variety of people. The ushers will invite people at each service to read out loud, one of the prayers.
- **We will be using loaves of fresh baked bread for Holy Communion**, baked by our own Frances Daniel and Dee McElroy.
- **Please try to park in the upper parking lot until it is full.** Too many people have told me that they drove by St. James for years and rarely saw any cars parked in the upper parking lot which communicates that nothing is going on here.
- **Name Tags:** Please wear your name tags during the season of Lent. This will help me learn everyone's names plus I already have heard from some of you that you do not know the names of everyone who attends, plus of course this helps any visitors we have. We will provide a **basket for name tags downstairs** for those of you at the **10:30 service** who come down for coffee hour. We will put them back up on the name tag board in alphabetical order on Mondays.

3. Lenten Programs: Soup and Bread Lunch

I will be leading two more programs on two Saturdays in March, the 16th and 23rd and the topics will be:

"Looking at Scripture from both sides now!" and **"Everything you want to know about Baptism and did not know to ask."** (The season of Lent is a typical time to prepare people for baptism, plus I just published a book on Baptism this last summer.). If things go well, we might schedule one more two mid-week Lenten programs during Lent.

Soup and bread will be served during these Lenten programs and many thanks to parishioners who have volunteered to provide our lunch on these days.

Sundays we say the Confession!

Every day during our morning prayer via zoom we begin with the Confession. Putting this first and up front allows us to acknowledge our sins and to seek God's forgiveness right away. It always makes me feel better in my heart to say it right then. So, we say the Confession and Father Jim declares absolution.

We continue into our daily lives carrying on as before. Do we pause throughout the day and think about what we just confessed? I don't. I do when I'm confessing and then I forget about it. Should we say it slower? Maybe we need to write the confession on our bathroom mirror, or in the kitchen and read it every time we are in there and reflect on it. I know I need to take the time to do so.

The Confession allows us time, and spiritual space, to reflect on our actions, to reflect on our behavior as followers of Jesus. We ask Him for guidance, to follow Him more closely and to grant forgiveness when we've gone astray. And we always ask for His loving kindness.

Oh, dear Lord, three things I pray: to see thee more clearly, love thee more dearly, follow thee more nearly, day by day, by day.....

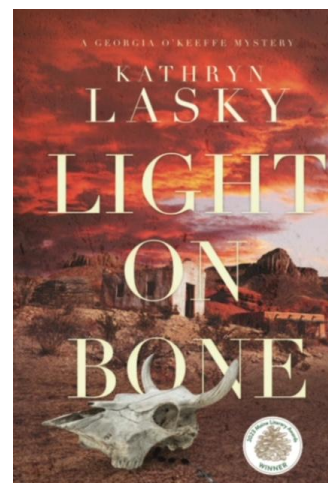


